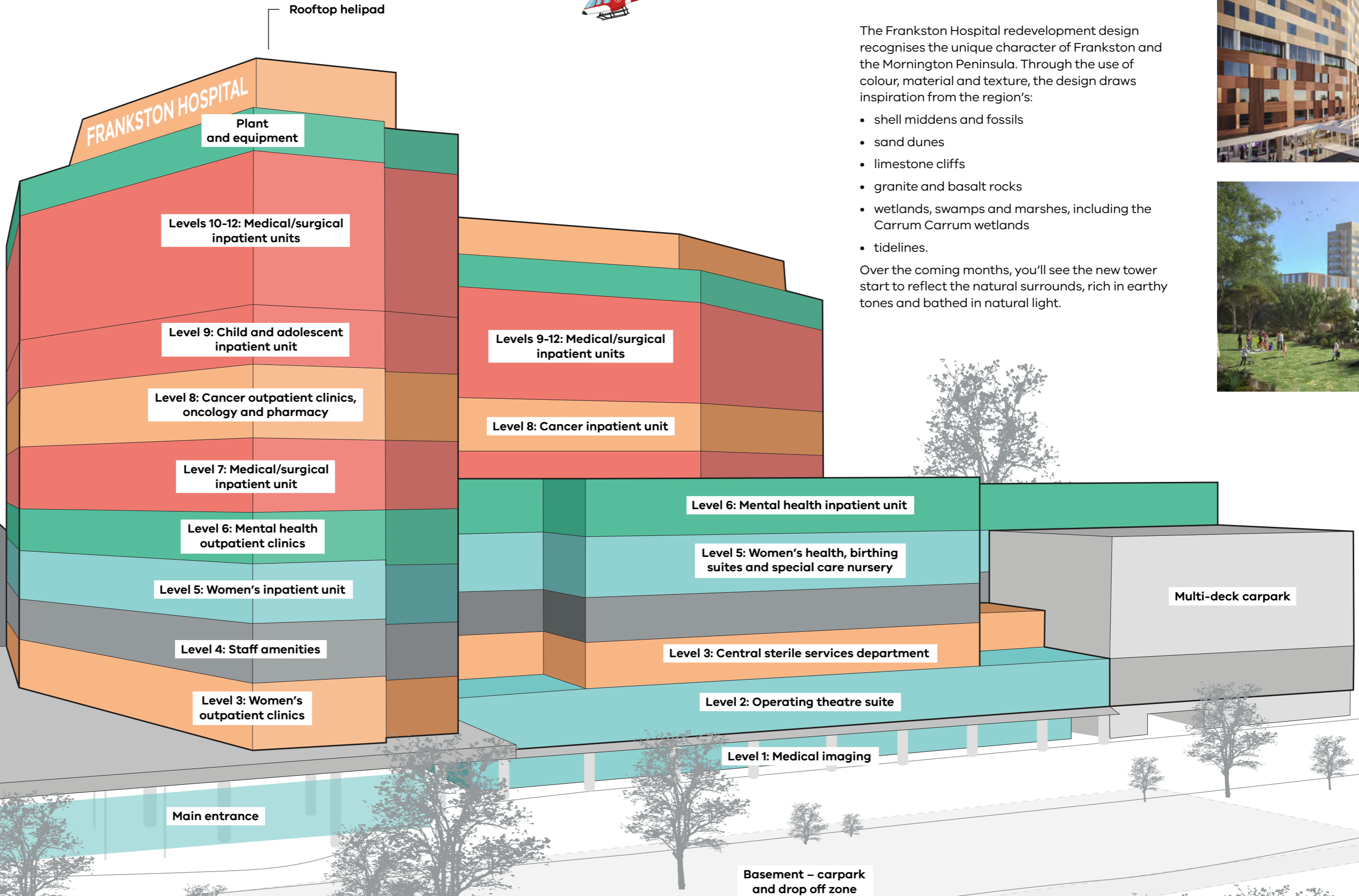

The Frankston Hospital redevelopment design recognises the unique character of Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula. Through the use of colour, material and texture, the design draws inspiration from the region's:

- shell middens and fossils
- sand dunes
- limestone cliffs
- granite and basalt rocks
- wetlands, swamps and marshes, including the Carrum Carrum wetlands
- tidelines.

Over the coming months, you'll see the new tower start to reflect the natural surrounds, rich in earthy tones and bathed in natural light.
